Although title of the conference emphasizes “Aromatic and Medicinal Plants of Southeast European Countries”, the conference will be a real medium for scientists and academicians from all over the world working on the same field. Therefore, 6<sup>th</sup> CMAPSEEC will constitute a global platform open to all researchers of any nationality, who would like to present their relevant studies as well as to establish new collaborations between participants of the Southeast European countries and rest of the world.

In this sense, Turkey is a bridge country between Europe and Asia, located on both of these continents. Besides, our country has a great biodiversity possessing approximately 12.000 plant species, 30% of which is endemic as well as an interesting fauna depending on the three different seas surrounding Turkey; The Black Sea, The Aegean Sea, and The Mediterranean Sea. Antalya, the conference location, is the largest city and year round holiday resort on the Turkish coast of the Mediterranean Sea. Antalya is also one of those unique places in the world where it is possible in the same day, to ski on snow in the morning and sunbath on the beach in the afternoon and many historical sites remained from the Romans’ periods. The city is also called “Turkish Riviera” because of its archeological richness and natural beauty of the area.

The conference will cover the 10 plenary lectures, 3 special lectures, 59 oral presentations, and 423 poster presentations on the topics of all aspects of medicinal and aromatic plants including cultivation, processing, and conservation of medicinal plants, bioactivity of natural products, natural product chemistry, ethnobotany and ethnomedicine, analysis and activity of essential oils, and plant biotechnology. The conference venue is the Convention Center of Hotel Kervansaray-Lara in Antalya. Up to date, over 400 participants from 50 countries have registered and we hope that AMAPSEEC will gain many new members through this occasion. We would like to remind you that the 6<sup>th</sup> CMAPSEEC will also be a special atmosphere to celebrate 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of foundation of AMAPSEEC.

As a final word, we (as the organizing and social committees) look forward to welcoming and hosting all of you in Antalya, Turkey on the occasion of 6<sup>th</sup> CMAPSEEC on April 18<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup>, 2010.
